Residents gave feedback using 'Post-it Notes' on key questions we asked

- · What is bothering you?
- What do you like about Witherley and Atterton?
- Would you like social events and if so, what would you want?
- · What is it that you want from WANA?
- Do you WANA volunteer?
 How would you like to be involved?
 What do you think you can offer?



Most comments received 7 key themes emerged

- Flooding e.g. Mythe & Atterton Lane, sewage, impact on access, deliveries
- Traffic-e.g. access to A5, speeding on Kennel Lane, parking, lack of pedestrian access around village
- 3. Development e.g. outside Village boundary, Kennel Lane & Chapel Field sites
- 4. Witherley Parish council e.g. representation,
- 5. School e.g. impact of development
- Environment e.g. loss of country side hedgerows, natural wildlife
- No Local Plan to support development & control



Reporting Fly Tipping

- Atterton Lane has been a site of fly tipping
- Since January 2024 WANA have reported 14 separate incidents of fly tipping to HBBC

Raising Awareness of Dog Fouling

 Arranging for the "pick it up" signs to be sprayed on the pavements



Ongoing Dog Fouling problems around the Village

WANA have been in contact with the Clean Neighbourhood Team at Hinckley and Bosworth Borough Council, they will be visiting Witherley to spray the "clean it up" sign in our problem areas. The signs are only temporary, will wash away, but may help.

Anyone can report a dog owner who fails to clear up their dog's mess to HBBC- to the Neighbourhood Warden Team . A name, description of the owner and dog or even a car registration can help track the person down.




Recognising our Village heroes

Leicestershire Highways discovered broken drainage pipes when they were investigating with Tony Carter and Mark Bloomer on Friday. Hopefully they will be repaired urgently.

Meanwhile the kindly HBBC roadsweeper who came out on Friday has promised to return first thing Monday morning.

And those blocked drains on Mythe Lane? They can't be cleared until the surface water has gone. I just hope the rain forecast for today is light.

FLOODING

This October has seen some of the worst flooding in recent memory, with Mythe Lane inaccessible for 15 days, and reflooded within 24hrs.

We thank Flood Warden Tony Carter and his deputies for their huge efforts while Denise Bloomer has lobbied hard with the responsible agencies to get the impact of the Witherley Flooding recognised. The WANA planning subgroup will continue to focus on the issue bringing pressure on the agencies responsible.

Leicestershire County Council are holding a drop in for residents to speak to agencies about the flooding,6pm on the 7th November at County Hall.






WANA Keeping our Village attractive

Planning Sub-Group

- Had regular monthly meetings to develop a comprehensive understanding of the issues affecting the village.
- Met with the Head of Planning at HBBC to discuss our concerns about development and flooding in the area.
- Attended HBBC council meetings to present our concerns about local planning applications
- Maintained regular contact with Severn Trent Water and developed key contacts for flooding and drainage issues, and the now completed supply upgrade.
- Attended the West Leicestershire flooding drop-in session.
- Represented WANA at a multi-agency flooding action meeting held in December.
